The BOS have requested a report from the Waterways Comm. every two months to provide closer monitoring.

The suggestion that the dredge material be placed in a depression at the transfer station presented some problems, one of which was that the dredged material conductivity levels must not exceed DEP requirements. Mr. Hanks indicated that the next step would consist of taking core samplings in the spring and getting them measured for conductivity to see whether they fall within DEP requirements. If they exceed DEP requirements, the proposed disposal site at the Transfer Station would not be allowed.

Save Mashpee Waterways presented petition signed by 550 citizens asking for actions to solve pollution crisis in Mashpee waters.

Mr. Hanks also discussed several other alternatives such as building marsh islands with the dredge spoils and the use of "side-casting" the spoils along marsh edges of the river. Mr. Hanks explained that these processes are much more difficult to permit and that "side-casting" may not be allowed by DEP. Town Planner, Tom Fudala, has suggested that this project may be characterized as marsh restoration, which is viewed more favorably by the State.
